Three days ago, I received news that brought me indescribable joy: Arthur Colin Peirce took his first breath on this earth. This little one is the firstborn son of my firstborn daughter. I will not recount the long journey that has resulted in this culmination. Suffice it to say: this new life is miraculous. More than rejoicing over the blessing of a new generation of my heritage, I celebrate with my daughter and son-in law for this new treasure that has entered their live – for he will certainly change their lives forever.

You may well have heard me describe the revelation that came to me soon after the birth of my daughter: Overcome with an indescribable protective love, I knew I would do anything – absolutely anything – for this young life than had been birthed into my own experience. And this, truly, is what I am most pleased about in the birth of Athur Colin Peirce: His presence will bless his parents with divine insight.

I pray that as little Arthur grows in years, he will come to learn well his parents' love for him — and how he was treasured long before he took his first breath. I pray that he will come to learn how he was uniquely knit together by his loving Creator who cherishes him more than he will ever know this side of heaven. And I pray that he will come to learn how he is treasured by his Pops, who eagerly anticipates holding him in his arms for the first time.

Women's Breakfast





The docks of Oakhaven were bustling, the air thick with the smell of salt and fish. Young Liam, the lighthouse keeper's apprentice, was on his way to help his Master when he ran into a group of the village boys. Usually, they were harmless, but tonight they had a wild look in their eyes.

"Hey, Liam!" called out the leader, a boy named Finn, holding up a small, heavy sack. "We're going to teach old Manas a lesson. He reported my uncle's boat for illegal netting, so we're going to 'borrow' the wick oil from the lighthouse storeroom. The beacon won't light tonight, and he'll be in trouble."

Liam's stomach tightened. Manas was a tough man, but he was fair, and the law was the law. More importantly, the beacon was crucial. It guided the fishing boats through the treacherous, rocky channel into the harbor. Without it, ships were in grave danger. "You can't do that, Finn," Liam said, his voice trembling slightly. "People could get hurt. The fishing fleet is due back with the high tide."

A few boys in the group looked uneasy, but Finn laughed. "Oh, come on, Liam. It's just for one night—a bit of fun. Don't be a dullard. Besides, everyone in the village agrees Manas is a rat." The other boys murmured in agreement.

Nov. 22: Mockingbird Hill Loop (4 miles; moderate, good views)






there is a comfortable seating arrangement, where visitors may enjoy classical music while perusing.






